#### **Larger Area of Premium Age Trees**

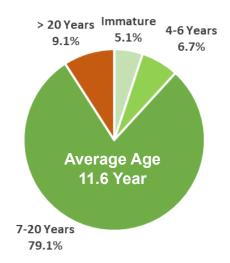
TAPG palm oil segment profit rose significantly compared to 1Q 2020 drive by higher productivity, efficient production cost, lower in Finance cost and foreign exchange.

FFB Production in 1Q 2021 increased ▲ 16.5% compared to Q1 2020 production, due to larger area of premium age trees.

CPO Production in 1Q 2021 reached 223 thousand tons increased ▲ 10.7% from Q1 2020 and PK Production reached 44 thousand tons increased ▲ 4.2% due to FFB Production and FFB purchase increased.

# **Land Fire Free Village Award**

# Delapan "Desa Peduli Api" di Batanghari dan Muarojambi terima penghargaan dari perusahaan perkebunan

Quoted from Antaranews.com, PT Brahma Binabakti (BBB), an oil palm plantation subsidiary of Triputra Agro Persada (TAPG) group, presented the Land Fire Free Village (Reward DBKL) award to eight villages in Muaro Jambi and Batanghari Districts, Jambi Province, for their efforts in achieving Zero Fire along the year of 2020. This reward is part of the Desa Makmur Peduli Api (DMPA) program which aims to empower the village economy to grow prosperously as well as to prevent Forest and Land Fires (Karhutla).

The government appreciated the initiative of the company to build and engage with communities in economic-based activities for preventing and overcoming Karhutla. Muaro Jambi Police Chief AKBP Ardiyanto explained that all companies in the Muaro Jambi Regency area must have facilities and infrastructure for Karhutla prevention and specially appointed personnel to deal with Karhutla. "Thank you to the company (PT BBB) which has given awards to 4 villages around the company in Muaro Jambi Regency which during 2020 have succeeded in protecting their land from fire," Ardiyanto said.

Meanwhile, Muaro Jambi Regional Secretary Ir. Azrin encouraged that the award program as an effort to prevent Karhutla should be used as an example by other companies in Muaro Jambi Regency. Other companies are also expected to work together and provide

education to local communities about the dangers of clearing land by burning. "PT BBB has done very good thing, meaning that the company has invited the local community to prevent Karhutla around the company," said Azrin.

In 2021, the Company (TAPG) will continue its programs regarding the prevention and control of Karhutla based on economic aspects and changes in community behavior. The DMPA program to build and develop the economic potential of villages in an inclusive manner is a long-term program to increase economic standards while changing the habits of local communities to clear land by burning.

The Company also provides full support and actively collaborates with the Fire Concerned Farmer Group (KTPA) through organizing socialization, training programs and providing infrastructure for prevention and response to potential hazards of forest and land fires. Incentive programs in the form of DBKL rewards are given by companies to villages that have succeeded in preventing Karhutla within a period of one year. This program is expected to motivate the community to give their best efforts in preventing Karhutla. For 2020, 28 villages have won this award, which are spread across 3 provinces (Jambi, Central Kalimantan and East Kalimantan). This award will also support DMPA activities which will later become BUMDES capital participation for the development of village economic activities.
